by Andrey Zvyagintsev | Russia | 2014 140 mins | Russian with English subtitles

Russia's official entry in the Oscars is an epic movie of biblical ambition and a haunting story about a modern Job. This jaded view of corruption in Putin's Russia makes for a long but compelling film. With music by Philip Glass it has won Best Foreign Language Film - Golden Globes 2015 and Best Screenplay -Cannes 2014. (JD)

What happens when ISIL arrives in your peaceful little Berber town? Timbuktu is a fearlessly poetic and almost surreal response to a jihadist occupation; it is beautiful and lyrical. Never preachy, it exposes the comparative contradictions in both cultures' ethics – sympathetic to the victims but also to those who know not what they do. (*JD*)

Childhood best friends Claire and Laura are inseparable, so it comes as a particularly devastating blow when Laura becomes ill and dies, leaving her husband, David, to raise their newborn daughter Lucie by himself. As Claire stops by his house one afternoon, door unlocked, she makes a surprising discovery that impacts her life and the lives of everyone close to her. *(TA)*

by Dietrich Brüggemann | Germany | 2014 | 107 mins German with English subtitles



14-year-old Maria seems to live in the modern world, but her family and her heart are faithful to a Catholic radicalism that requires sacrifice and devotion at every turn. Told in fourteen single shot tableaus that parallel Christ's journey to crucifixion, this is both an indictment of fundamentalist faith and the articulation of a teen's struggle to find her own path in life. As Cynthia begins to yearn for a more conventional relationship, Evelyn's obsession with erotica quickly becomes an addiction that threatens to push the relationship to breaking point. (*DG*)

Then her peculiar new neighbour steps in and offers to lend her a hand. From this unlikely beginning, all three characters move on to find a new sense of balance and hope. *(DG)*

Nostalgia for the Light

by Patricio Guzman | Chile | 2010 | 104 mins Spanish with English subtitles



Guzman weaves together a visual constellation of ideas about astronomy, deep time, the Universe, and the discoveries of ancient artefacts, with an underlying focus on the story of those who 'disappeared' after Pinochet's 1973 coup. The vast lunar landscape of the Atacama desert in Chile provides the linking matrix for this reflective documentary. (MT)

In the end though, you have to decide whether the strict traditions are being celebrated or critiqued. (DG)


